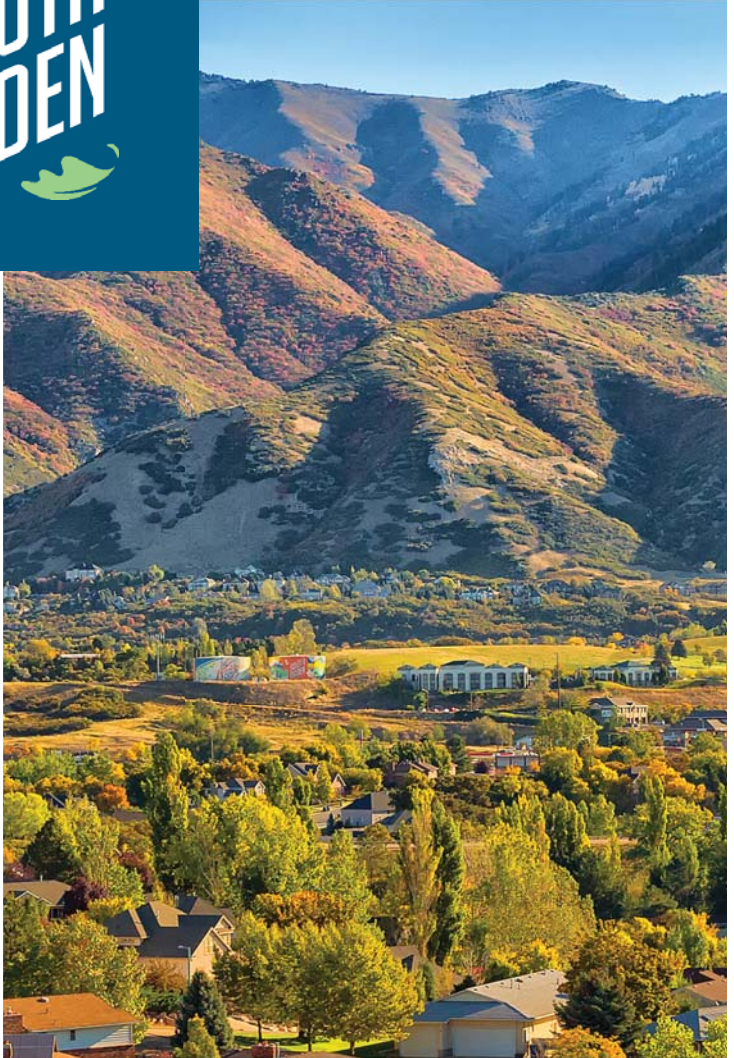

Dear New Resident,



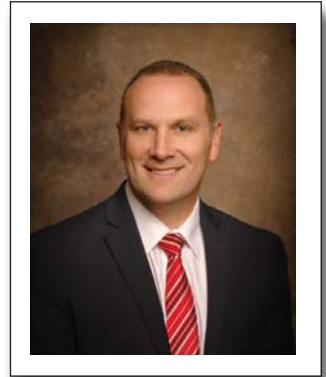
We wanted to provide you with this booklet of information to help you get acquainted with South Ogden and the surrounding areas. In

HISTORY

The origins of South Ogden as a community date back to 1848 when lands previously owned by the Mexican government were acquired by the United States. The resulting settlement became known as “Burch Creek”, named in honor of Daniel Burch, Jr., one of the first pioneers to settle in the area. The farming community was known for its open fields, rounded hills, and springs of sparkling, clear water.

Little development took place until after 1890, when change slowly took effect. One by one, lots were subdivided in what is now the northern part of the City. As time passed, “Burch Creek” became known as South Ogden. In 1936, the town of South Ogden became incorporated, with a population of 800. Five years later, the population had increased to 1,407, and South Ogden was classified as a third class City. Growth of the City continued in the area between 36th and 40th Streets. In 1947, Washington Heights (Lindquist) Memorial Park was established on the east side of Washington Blvd. south of the Ogden Golf and Country Club.

Modern historical development of South Ogden, as a suburban community was spurred by FHA-approved housing in 1949 and its easy access to major employment centers including Hill Air Force Base and Ogden City. Consequently, the City experienced its largest growth spurt in the 50’s. From 1950 to 1970, South Ogden grew at a rate two to three times faster than Weber County. Commercial development grew as well with many of the current businesses locating in the City’s major business district after 1960. The southern part of the city developed during the late 90’s and early 2000’s. Large areas south of Highway 89 were annexed into the city and another large business district was created at the intersection of Harrison Boulevard and Highway 89.

Today the city remains a beautiful place to work and live. The city’s future is also looking bright as city leaders focus their attention on redevelopment and putting regulations in place to direct the population growth expected in the next 20 years.

CITY GOVERNMENT

SOUTH OGDEN CITY'S ELECTED OFFICIALS

South Ogden City has six elected officials; a mayor and five city council members. Your elected officials want to hear from you. Your input is the best way for them to get a feel for what citizens want for their city. There are several ways you can voice your concerns:

Call or email — The mayor and council's contact information is available in the front of this brochure and on the city's website, southogdencity.com.

Attend a City Council meeting — Council meetings are held the first and third Tuesday of each month. Meetings start at 6:00 pm and are held in the Council Chambers at City Hall. An opportunity for public comment is held at the beginning of each meeting. Comments are limited to three minutes.

Comment during a public hearing — For substantial issues, the City holds public hearings. Public hearings are always advertised in the newspaper in the legal notice section and online at southogdencity.com. The hearings deal with specific issues for which the Council or Planning Commission is soliciting your input before a decision is made.

SCHEDULE OF MEETINGS

City Council: 1st and 3rd Tuesday of each month at 6 pm in the Council Chambers located at City Hall, with a pre-council work session at 5 pm.

Planning Commission: Determines current & future development/planning in the City. They meet on an as needed basis; when they do meet it will be the 2nd Thursday of the month at 6 pm in the Council Chambers.

Urban Forestry: Determines tree planning. 2nd Thursday of each month at 6:30 pm in the small conference room (Room #114.)

Appeal Hearings: A hearing officer hears appeals on zoning, building, or other appeal processes. These hearings are held as needed.

UTILITY BILLING INFORMATION

Utilities are billed monthly. Bills usually go out around the 5th of each month and are due the last working day of the month. There are several ways to pay your bill:

Online payments/Auto pay: Offered through our city website www.southhodgencity.com. We take Visa, MasterCard, Discover and online check. At the home page, click on the “I Want To...” tab and drop down to “Pay My Water Bill.” This will re-direct you to the Xpress Bill Pay sight. You can then follow the prompts from the site. You will need to know your utility account number to set up a payment account on Xpress Bill Pay. For any technical questions, call Xpress Bill Pay support at 1-800-766-2350.

Utility billing direct pay: We will withdraw money directly from your bank account either through checking or savings. Payments will be withdrawn on the 25th of the month. An agreement form for direct withdrawal can be filled out at city hall.

Drive-up payment drop box: Located in the parking lot east of city hall. We ask that you do not put cash in the drop box for security reasons.

Mail: Send a check in the provided envelope with your pay stub. There will be a \$10 late fee on past due utility accounts. There will be a \$25 reconnect fee (\$35 if the reconnect takes place on weekends, after-hours, or holidays) for any past due accounts shut off due to non-payment.

If your water is turned off for non-payment, DO NOT TURN IT BACK ON. Turning the water back on or allowing the water to be turned back on without city authorization is a violation of City Ordinance 8-1-11 and is a serious offense. If someone other than the city turns the water back on, a lock will be placed on the box and a penalty fee of \$100 automatically charged to the resident. If the lock is removed by anyone other than the city, the crime is punishable as a Class B Misdemeanor for theft of services. In addition, if the water meter or water meter shutoff is damaged in any way, you may be responsible for the repair.

GARBAGE & RECYCLING INFORMATION

South Ogden contracts with Republic Services for garbage service. Regular garbage cans are picked up once a week on your regularly scheduled garbage day. Your recycle service day will be every other week on the same day as your regular trash service. Call 801-622-2700 if you don't know your day for garbage service. Please have your containers out by 6 am. Remember to put the cans at least 3-4 feet away from each other or any other item.

If you have any problems with a broken garbage can, or if you need additional cans or a can picked up, please call 801-622-2700.

Republic Services has six days a year they take off for the holidays. These holidays are: New Years Day, Memorial Day, July 4th, Labor Day, Thanksgiving, and Christmas. Garbage service will be delayed one day during the week of these holidays.

Grass, green waste, or wood

Styrofoam, bubble wrap, packing peanuts

Plastic toys, large plastic items, laundry baskets

Batteries

Containers with liquid

South Ogden City does not sponsor any soccer leagues. AYSO is the sponsor of soccer in and around South Ogden. Call 801-475-0186 for more information on local soccer leagues or go to www.ayso151.org to register.

PARKS

Following is a list of parks and their amenities:

40th Street Park is located at 40th St. and Adams Ave. It has a bowery with 30 tables, a playground with swings, tennis, basketball courts and restrooms. This park also has lots of grass area to run around and play games. No dogs are allowed at this park.

Burch Creek Park is located at 4400 Madison Ave. It has 8 pickle ball courts, hill climb structure, maze, exercise stations, playground, and water feature. It also has 2 boweries, restrooms, and sledding hill.

Club Heights Park is located at 4100 Palmer Drive. It has a baseball diamond with lights, a bowery with 12 tables, restrooms and playground equipment. A portion of this park has been designated as an off-leash area for dogs; it is open April 1 to November 1 every year.

Madison Park is located at 4100 South and Madison Ave. This park has a small bowery with 4 tables and a restroom. No dogs allowed.

Farrell Park is located at 1450 E 5600 S. It has a playground and small bowery. Dogs are not allowed.

Friendship Park, located at 5500 S 650 E, has 3 baseball fields, a soccer field, a football field, sand volleyball court and tennis courts. It also has a bowery with 30 tables, restrooms, a playground with swings and an asphalt pathway around the outside edge. No dogs are allowed.

Glasmann Park is located at 5275 Glasmann Way. This park has restrooms, an asphalt pathway around the park, and shelters with picnic tables. Dogs are allowed, but must be on a leash at all times.

Meadows Park, located at 5774 S 1900 E, has a small playground with swings. Dogs are not allowed.

Nature Park is located at 5875 S 1175 E, behind the Ogden Athletic Club. It has a bowery with restrooms, playground, splash pad, large grass areas and a very extensive trail system through approximately 50 acres of land, and a small amphitheater. The splash pad runs from Memorial Day to Labor Day from 10 a.m. to 8 p.m. On-leash dogs only.

Bowery rentals are available for the following parks: 40th St., Friendship, Burch Creek, Madison, and Club Heights. Reservations are available from April 15 to October 15, 8 am to 9 pm. A reservation guarantees use of the pavilion and restrooms, not other amenities. Fee is \$75 for residents with a \$25 refund if bowery is left clean; non-residents pay \$100 with a \$25 refund. If you are interested in renting a bowery, please call 801-622-2700.

DOING BUSINESS IN SOUTH OGDEN

SOUTH OGDEN BUSINESS ALLIANCE (SOBA)

BUSINESS LICENSES

South Ogden values and supports our business community. If you need a business license, go online to southogden.bizmuni.com to apply.

South Ogden does not require home based businesses to have a city business license; however, we will issue a license to home businesses by request.

BANNERS FOR EVENTS OR BUSINESS PROMOTIONS

South Ogden wants you to be able to promote your business or event, but at the same time keep our city visually uncluttered. If you are a church, civic, or charitable organization promoting an event, call 801-622-2913 for information on where you can place your banner. If you are a commercial business, you may have two banners by permit for 30 days each during the year. Call 801-622-2913 for specific information or to get a permit.

PUBLIC WORKS

South Ogden Public Works is located at 5590 S 600 E. Hours are from 7:00 a.m. to 3:30 pm Monday through Friday. The Public Works Department maintains the city streets, sewer, storm drain and water systems. Following is helpful information from the Public Works Department.

DUMPSTER RENTALS

South Ogden City has three types of dumpster rental programs:

The Neighborhood Cleanup Program: This program has a minimal \$100 refundable deposit for up to 5 households to share a 30 cubic yard roll-off dumpster for a two day period. Republic Services will deliver the dumpster to the address listed on the application. This is for residential use only and available one time per year per five households.

The Mixed Waste Trailer: The mixed waste trailer is for individual use only and requires an \$80 fee and a \$100 refundable deposit for a two-day period. The mixed waste trailer can be used for green waste as well as household type garbage.

The Green Waste Trailer: The green waste trailer is for individual use only and requires a \$45 fee and a \$100 refundable deposit for a two-day period. The green waste trailer can be used only for green waste items such as grass clippings, tree branches and leaves.

No toxic, hazardous, flammable materials, or demolition items may be deposited into any of these dumpsters or trailers. If they are, the responsible person signing for the trailer may be charged for the entire disposal fee. All trailers and dumpsters are for residential use only. Application packages may be obtained at the Public Works Dept. or on city's website at www.southogdencity.com. For further questions, call 801-622-2901.

WATER OR SEWER PROBLEMS

If you notice water seeping from the ground or from the bottom of a fire hydrant (or ice around the bottom of it), please contact Public Works and report it as soon as possible. If it is a large leak, please contact dispatch at 801-629-8221 immediately. Please do not assume someone else has already called it in. This may be a main break or hydrant problem. Other than costing us the valuable water resource, it may also be a potential hazard and cause further damage to the area.

Sewer line backups are a very common problem. Most often the sewer backup is in an individual line between the house and the sewer main. This

is called the sewer lateral. Occasionally the backup can be caused by a clog in the sewer main line. Some of the more serious damages might be averted with a quick phone call and a little knowledge. Always call the Public Works Department first if you notice sewage or water coming up in your floor drain or basement toilets. We have people on call 24 hours a day to respond to these types of emergencies. A quick call can verify whether the plug is in your own sewer lateral or perhaps a city main line. If the water backing up in the floor drain is constant, and you are not using any water, it may be a city main. If the water only backs up when you use a washer, dishwasher, or even run water down a sink, it is most likely your own line. Tree roots are usually the main cause of sewer line backups, both private and public. If you have had trouble in the past it is a good idea to routinely have your sewer lateral cleaned by a licensed plumber or sewer maintenance company. South Ogden's phone number is 801-622-2901 Monday-Friday 7:00 am - 3:30 pm or after hours emergencies 801-629-8221. Please keep these phone numbers available if such an emergency arises.

SNOW REMOVAL AND PARKING

It is illegal to park or leave anything on the road from Nov. 1 to Apr. 1 between 1 am and 7 am and during or after a snowstorm. Parking interferes with snow removal. Plows will not return to clear snow from an area where a vehicle has been parked. The city follows a priority list when plowing streets. First priority are those streets that are intensely used, such as collector roads and roads with excessive grade. Priority two are arterial streets that carry traffic to collector streets. Priority three would include all other residential streets in a typical subdivision. Finally, priority four would include cul-de-sacs and dead end streets.

It is unlawful for anyone to park or leave a vehicle for more than 48 hours on any street, public road, alley, or municipal property. Remember, these laws were enacted to protect your property from damage and others from injury.

DIGGING

We would like to remind you to always call Blue Stakes before you dig. If you do not have a site Blue Staked prior to digging and you hit a utility service (even in your own yard), you will be responsible for the cost of the repairs. Blue Stakes locating does not cost anything. It is a free service to you. The phone number is 1-800-662-4111.

POLICE

The police department is comprised of patrol, investigations, animal services and code enforcement.

CONTACTING THE SOUTH OGDEN POLICE DEPARTMENT

One of the best ways to keep South Ogden a great place to live and work is communication between the Police Department and the community. Too often people are reluctant to call us because they aren't sure if they should. If you find yourself asking the question "Should I call the police?" the answer is probably yes. Your Police Officers are trained professionals who will determine if the circumstances are criminal, or someone needing assistance. There are a variety of ways to contact the South Ogden Police Department. The best way for nonemergency police, medical, or fire events is to call 801-629-8221. All police, medical, and fire in the county use the same dispatch center with that number. Take a moment to enter the number in your phone under "Police." Use the same number for code enforcement and animal services.

CODE ENFORCEMENT

To help keep the city clean and esthetically pleasing there are ordinances regarding weeds, inoperable vehicles and debris on property. If a property is not in compliance an officer will notify the owner to correct the problem. If it is not corrected the city may take action and file a lien against the property for the expense. Property owners may be given a citation and fined. There are state regulations which must be followed during this process. Most owners take prompt action once contacted while others take longer. We appreciate you notifying us of a problem and your patience as we correct it.

ANIMAL SERVICES

SOPD operates a no-kill shelter. The shelter is by the Public Works buildings at 5594 S 600 E to the east of the Library on Adams Avenue. The shelter is not staffed full-time, so assistance can be obtained by calling the police dispatch center at 801-629-8221. We do micro chipping for \$20 per animal, and hold adoption events and vaccination clinics on a regular basis. Scheduled events can be found by calling our shelter at 801-622-2949 or by visiting us on the city website or Facebook at <https://www.facebook.com/SouthOgdenAnimalServices>. We also have opportunities for volunteers and animal foster parents. Please contact us for details!

City ordinance allows up to three cats and/or two dogs on your property. All dogs must be licensed annually, kept on a leash when not on your property, and not be a nuisance by excessive barking or howling.

License renewals are available from January 1 through February 28. A \$20.00 late fee will be assessed after March 1 unless you have just moved into the city. If you have just moved to the city or just acquired a dog, you must license your pet within 30 days. Proof of current rabies vaccination is required for all licenses each year.

Altered dog: \$10.00

Non-altered dog: \$30.00

Altered dog (senior citizen/55 years or older): \$7.00

Non-altered dog (senior citizen/55 years or older): \$20.00

Lifetime License for altered, micro chipped dogs is \$75.00, \$20.00 for seniors.

FIRE

South Ogden City's Fire Department provides services to South Ogden and surrounding communities through the staffing of two fire stations. Station 81, Fire Department Headquarters is located at 3950 S. Adams Ave. Station 82 is located at 5635 Wasatch Drive.



FIREWORKS

Class “C” fireworks are available for purchase on the following dates: June 23-27, December 29-31, and three consecutive days preceding the Chinese New Year.

DISCHARGE DATES:

July 2-5, July 22-25 and Chinese New Year's Eve.

Discharge Times: 11 am to 11 pm, except as noted below:

July 4 and July 24 - hours are extended to midnight

New Year's Eve and Chinese New Year's Eve—hours are extended to 1 am.

By order of the Fire Marshall, fireworks may be prohibited in certain areas of the city due to dry conditions and/or high winds.

BURN PERMITS

Open Burning and Wood Burning/Recreational Fires (Fire Pits/Cooking Fires) require a burn permit. There is no fee, but you must apply at the Utah Department of Environmental Quality website, deq.utah.gov. On the home page go to the search box under “Help me find...” and type in “burn permit.” Select “Utah DEQ: Open Burning” to begin the application process. You will need to select “South Ogden City” from the drop down under “Weber County”. The local Fire Department will receive a copy of the application. There is not a fee, but you must follow the directions for correct burning. The rules and restrictions are listed on this website. You are required to have a copy of your application on site during any open burning.

FIRE PITS

Small recreational, cooking and educational fires are allowed with a wood burning permit. Bon Fires are not allowed. Ground level fire pits must be

made of steel, concrete, rocks, brick etc. and less than 36” diameter. Fire pits should be at least 15 feet from structures, combustible materials and overhead tree limbs. Portable fire pits and fireplaces (chimeneas) should be operated per manufactures recommendations and be at least 15 feet from structures and combustible materials.

Natural gas or propane fire pits and fireplaces should be operated per manufacture’s recommendations and have a minimum clearance from combustibles of 36” on the sides and 78” above. A charged water hose with a shut off nozzle must be located near the fire pit.
